Paul St George: THE TELECTROSCOPE

London and New York 22 May – 15 June 2008

Transatlantic engineering project nears completion

A long-forgotten tunnel connecting London and New York is due to open this summer.

Artist and inventor Paul St George has announced his plans to complete the astonishingly ambitious engineering project started by his great grandfather, Alexander Stanhope St George, more than a century ago.

Using maps and drawings discovered in family archives, Mr. St George has tracked down the location of the original excavation and is now finishing the drilling project that will complete a tunnel connecting London to New York.

The tunnel is only part of the story, however. Once it is completed, each end will be fitted with a Telectroscope – an extraordinary optical device also invented by his ancestor, designed to magnify the view through the tunnel thus allowing people on one side of the Atlantic to see those people on the other side.

"Several people throughout the 1890s claimed to have invented the Telectroscope, but nobody ever built one," says Paul St George. "I can now prove that my great grandfather was the only person with a workable plan – and finally I am in a position to turn that plan into a reality. Alexander Stanhope St George was not a dreamer, but an engineer of real genius with a practical and achievable vision."

This project chimes perfectly with St George's own practice as an artist. Paul is fascinated by the overlapping territory that exists between illusion and reality; between optical effect and perception. He delights in confusing and mesmerizing his audience.

In London the Telectroscope will appear on the South Bank in the shadow of Tower Bridge whilst the other end will appear at the foot of the Brooklyn Bridge on the Brooklyn side of the East River. Precise locations will be revealed in due course.
